

# Victorian Rock Lobster Committee (VRLC) Meeting #6 – 18 May 2023 Location: Zoom Meeting

## **Chairperson's Summary**

This was the sixth meeting of the Victorian Rock Lobster Committee. Key items discussed included:

- Trans-Tasman Rock Lobster Conference
- Clean Green Program
- 2023/24 TACC & fee relief
- Compensation for seismic surveying
- Export Trade
- Marine Stewardship Council

## Trans-Tasman Rock Lobster Conference

- Unanimous support for Chair and SIV CEO to attend upcoming conference.
- Unanimous support for conference sponsorship.
- Bursary opportunities to be advertised across all licence holders for expressions of interest.

## **Clean Green Program**

- Program to train and maintain industry operations at world's best practice standards.
- Opportunity for SIV to undertake administration of the program if resources allow and funding is deemed adequate.

# 2023/24 TACC & fee relief

## Eastern Zone TACC

- Rock Lobster Resource Advisory Group (RLAG) noted that whilst PRI is recovering from the recent historical low period it was still only just met.
- Given the extended history of stock issues in this zone, RLRAG advised caution when considering the TACC.

## Western Zone TACC

- The key trends in the Western Zone have continued to show improvement.
- The current harvest strategy specified that a TACC increase was available, however this would have exceeded the target exploitation rate by more than 10 percent.
- RLRAG recommendation to adjust the TACC slightly to align with the rebuilding plan under the new DRAFT revised harvest strategy.

## Eastern Zone Fee Relief

- In support of the EZ pursuing a stronger rebuilding plan, the VFA committed to providing an adjustment to licence fees for the upcoming quota period.
- Total \$149 K fee relief provided to the EZ whilst a precautionary TACC and review of the cost recovery model is undertaken \$50 K waiver plus reduced research/compliance.

VRLC responses

- No objection raised about TACC outcomes (EZ 21 Tonnes, WZ 142 Tonnes)
- Unanimous VRLC agreement that EZ fee relief is a very positive result. Recognition given for SIV's role in advocating for maximum fee relief.

• Given the reduction in data collection to allow for greater fee relief, EZ licence holders should support more voluntary data collection to inform robust management of fishery.

#### Compensation for future seismic surveying

• SIV to look at past and proposed frameworks for quantifying displaced fishing effort/catch.

#### Export Trade

- There remains a lack of clarity on the status of current conversations between Australian and Chinese trade officials.
- SIV to work with SIA on obtaining more information on trade discussions and have confidence that lobster is an area of focus.

#### **Marine Stewardship Council**

- Feedback from Port Visits included requests from industry regarding what the long-term cost/benefit of MSC might look like.
- VRLC to request insights from SRL Ltd.
